Sandra's father died when she was seven years old. She joined our program in high school and we were immediately impressed by her self-confidence. As a new student, she campaigned for the position of Head Girl and won the election. After secondary school, she expressed interest in studying for a Diploma in Procurement & Supplies Management. We pointed out that it was a highly competitive field and she may find it difficult to find employment. She replied, "Help me to get my Diploma and I will find a job." Shortly after graduation she was hired by a large boarding school as their Purchasing Manager.

Sandra married and had a daughter. She opened a small retail business of her own, but felt that she should be doing more. Last year, she approached us about starting her own charitable organization. With our advice and direction, she successfully navigated the complicated bureaucratic nightmare of establishing an NGO in Uganda and was approved. She now works with women and children in city slums and rural communities, assisting them with education, health care, and economic empowerment.



The St. Nicholas Uganda Children's Fund supports over 250 orphans and vulnerable children in primary & secondary school, vocational & professional training, and university. We pay school fees and provide uniforms, shoes & socks, school supplies, meals, and health care. With your help, we can make a real difference in their young lives.
