He completed Advanced Level secondary school last year as our top performing student. His subject combination included Biology, Chemistry, and Mathematics. Enock has a consistent track record of success: He was also our top student in both the O Level secondary exams and the Primary Leaving Exams.

On Monday he will begin his studies at a medical college in Kampala, pursuing a Diploma in Clinical Medicine and Community Health. As a Clinical Officer, he will perform patient assessment & treatment, disease management, triage, and minor surgical procedures. The training curriculum is regulated by the Uganda Allied Health Professionals Council and emphasizes the diagnosis and treatment of patients in primary healthcare as well as disease prevention and community health.

COVID-19 Update

As of this date Uganda has reported 40,452 cases and 344 deaths. The first batches of the AstraZeneca vaccine have arrived in the country and will be administered to people who are most vulnerable, healthcare workers, and other essential service providers.
